## Aquaculture – Movement of live fish – Northern Ireland consignee checklist

The Northern Ireland consignee (person responsible for the consignment in NI), must follow the below steps in order to successfully move live fish / ornamental fish / live shellfish / trout eggs, from GB to NI or Rest of the World (RoW) to NI via GB:

You must first receive a digital copy (e.g. a colour-copy PDF scan) of the <a href="Export Health">Export Health</a>
<a href="Certificate">Certificate (EHC)</a> and supporting documentation associated with the consignment from your GB supplier:

- The Export Health Certificate (EHC) will have been provided to the GB supplier by the Competent Authority in GB (Marine Scotland or CEFAS). If your supplier is a GB consolidator and the consignment originates from outside GB (i.e. RoW), the EHC will be provided by the Competent Authority in the RoW country of origin.
- There is also the option for NI businesses to import live fish from RoW countries via GB without using the services of a GB consolidator. \*The EHC will be needed for your next step: 'Pre-Notification'

## Pre-notification

- You must <u>pre-notify</u> the Northern Ireland Point of Entry (POE). (NB: You can only import live fish through Larne Port or Belfast Port).
- Pre-notification must be done <u>a minimum 24 hours in advance</u> of the arrival of the consignment.
- Pre-notification is done online through the <u>TRACES-NT</u> (Trade Control and Expert System New Technology) system.

- Your registration must be approved before you can use TRACES-NT. Therefore, if you are not already registered, you need to register now as an "operator" and a "business user". Guidance for registering is available <a href="here">here</a>.
- You must complete Part 1 of the <u>Common Health Entry Document (CHED)</u> on TRACES-NT. A CHED-A is used for live animals. Find a step-by step guide on how to create a CHED-A here.
  - \* Please note, you will need to have the activities of 'animal importer' and 'responsible for the load' validated (by DAERA) on TRACES-NT in order to complete the CHED-A.
- Whilst creating the CHED, you must upload the colour-scanned digital copy of the Export Health Certificate (EHC) and all the supporting documentation onto TRACES-NT. \*Please note: the document(s) may be too large to be sent as one file. DAERA will therefore accept them if sent in two parts. Once you have completed Part 1 of the Common Health Entry Document (CHED) on TRACES-NT with all the necessary details, click "Submit for decision".

Notification on TRACES-NT is the responsibility of the Importer/agent of the importing Country under Article 15 of Regulation (EC)2017/625. The operator responsible (EU importer) for the consignment entering the Union, must ensure that all the required documentation is in place (Export Health

This is the end of the pre-notification stage: you do not need to do anything else at this point.

## Checks on arrival

- Ensure the product enters at a <u>Point of Entry (POE)</u> that has EU designation for that product. You can only import live fish through the following Points of Entry (POE) in Northern Ireland:

- Larne Port;
- Belfast Port;

The driver must follow the signs to the designated inspection facilities at the port.

Please note: for Live fish imports – you must proceed for inspection to Duncrue

Street OCTA at Belfast Port and to Redlands Road OCTA at Larne Port.

- ✓ The Competent Authority will conduct checks on the consignments and will decide to accept, partially accept or refuse the consignment.
- ✓ If the checks have been successful, the consignment is cleared: the decision is entered in Part 2 of the CHED, which will be provided to the consignee in electronic form. Your consignment is now free to move to destination.

## Please note the following:

- It is the responsibility of the **person responsible for the load** to ensure that the consignment meets the <u>legislative requirements</u> for movement into Northern Ireland.
- The original Export Health Certificate (EHC) and the supporting documentation must remain with the consignment **throughout** the journey.
- Further information for the **GB consignor** can be found <u>here</u>.
- You need an EORI number to move goods between Great Britain or the Isle of Man and other countries (including the EU). You may also need a separate EORI number if you move goods to or from Northern Ireland. For further information visit <a href="https://www.gov.uk/eori">https://www.gov.uk/eori</a>
