## Shared Learning Programme



Community groups across Belfast and Derry-Londonderry are very experienced in developing innovative approaches to social challenges. The Urban Villages Initiative helps local groups and residents across all five Urban Village areas to build connections and share learning on ways to make a difference.

The Colin Allotments and Healthy Living Centre in West Belfast hosted a Shared Learning event in November. This is one of the region's biggest allotments projects and includes a community facility constructed from repurposed shipping containers.

Presentations highlighted ways the Allotments are used to support educational and health outcomes. This includes cooking and horticultural courses for residents and school children. The Public Health Agency and Colin Men's Shed showcased community initiatives promoting mental health.

First time visitors to Colin came away with new contacts and sources of advice to advance similar initiatives in their own areas.

New Year resolutions were very topical at a Health and Wellbeing event in Derry-Londonderry in January. The Shared Learning event at Bishop Street Community Centre highlighted community based approaches to promoting healthy lifestyles.

The work of the Bogside and Brandywell Health Forum showcased school, family-based and workplace approaches to good health. The Pink Ladies Cancer Support Group demonstrated the power of committed people and volunteers to support others. Dove House Community Trust highlighted the importance of financial support and advice services to help people at times of crisis. People also left the event in Derry-Londonderry with a better understanding





of creative techniques to support wellbeing and the delivery of health based approaches

# Awakening the Walls

Bogside, Fountain & Bishop Street

Schools and Youth Clubs worked together to creatively Awaken the Walls

'Under a Samhain Moon' was a collaborative projection mapping project between local schools, youth clubs and arts organisations as part of Derry City & Strabane District Council's Awakening The Walls initiative as part of The Foyle Halloween Festival.

The project, involved 119 young people in workshops and a 2-day adult masterclass provided by industry experts Guerrilla Shout. The creative sessions were held across the Urban Village areas in the Cathedral Youth Club, Pilots Row Youth Club, Long Tower School, Gaelscoil Éadain Mhóir and the Fountain Primary School.

Children & young people received an overview of the project and an introduction to projection mapping





technology. Participants then created artwork on the theme of Under a Samhain Moon, which was then included as part of the projections at the Awakening The Walls event.

They created several projection installations across the Bogside, Bishop Street and Fountain Urban Village. They developed a supernatural illuminated animation trail for three evenings before Halloween and attracting an audience of over 30,000 people!

The trail ran from Free Derry Corner to Hawkin Street, on to Bishop's Gate and through to the Fountain. The installations allowed residents and visitors to see these parts of the city in a more positive new light.



This collaboration included Guerrilla Shout, Celtronic, Bluebell Arts, New Gate Arts and Culture Centre, Youth First, Cathedral Youth Club, Pilots Row Youth Club, Long Tower Youth Club, Gaelscoil Éadain Mhóir, Long Tower PS, Fountain PS.

## The Bog Couple

The Bog Couple is the highlight of the Playhouse Spring programme, a comedy play that features the Rossville flats and the Bogside.

The key theme of the play is cross-community friendship, it offers a feel-good factor with a focus on the fact that there is more that unites than divides us all.

The play is a high tech major production that features sophisticated lighting and tech design; it will feature some of the North West's leading actors along with support from 19 enthusiastic young novices recruited from the Urban Village area of the Bogside, Fountain and Bishop Street.

The new recruits have shown an interest in all aspects of theatre, from set building to light and sound design, acting and directing to stage manager work.

These 19 young people have set off on the journey of bringing this play from page to stage, upskilling in theatre and creative skills, and becoming part of the team delivering and putting this feature play on.

The group of young people have shown specific interests in particular aspects, some have immersed themselves in lighting design, others have engaged in rehearsal and directing sessions, and a particular group of about 10 are interested in set design and set build, so once a week there is a dedicated set design workshop group.

In addition to the major fullscale production there will be play performed in local community centres, with a discussion about the processes of theatre. The plan is that the young interns take part in the programme to technically deliver and produce these performances.

Written by Dr Liam Campbell and directed by Kieran Griffiths the play will hold a series of readings, performances, and workshops in the Bogside, Fountain and Bishop Street.

There is an 'Employability in the Creative Industries Certificate' attached to this programme that has proven useful and enhances CVs. The young people gain vital experience and training in design, build and backstage skills. The Creative Industries has been identified by the Executive as an area of economic growth.

### A Celebration of Life

Based in Bishop Street Community Centre, the Pink Ladies is a formidable group of talented and resourceful ladies providing a range of Cancer support services for women, men and children affected by cancer.

In December 2017, they hosted a concert, "A Celebration of Life', held in The Guildhall. Billed as a 'thank you' to the people of Derry-Londonderry for their unending support, the Christmas Celebration and Reflection Concert was an uplifting night of music and song that attracted an audience of over 500 people.

Joining the Pink Ladies Choir on stage were musicians of all ages and backgrounds from the local community, including Long Tower and Fountain Primary School Choir, Momentum Community Choir and Oakgrove Primary School Choir. The Pink Ladies also collaborated with staff from the recently opened North West Cancer Centre Choir who formed a fantastic choir especially for the concert.

The event also featured performances from the inimitable Saint Sister, Paul Casey, Conor McGinty and Anne Marie Hickey, and a highlight of the evening was featured recording contributions from Phil Coulter and Snow Patrol.

# Know it, Change it, Live it!

WHAT'S COMING UP

The Know it, Change it, Live it (KCL) project is unique to Dove House Community Trust. The project supports low income families, specifically targeting those who are on benefits and/or those working that find their income is not enough to suffice.

The project is currently engaged with six families and supports them through a tailored 5-week program to meet the particular needs of each family. The sessions cover, money maximisation; financial inclusion; avoiding food wastage and the psychology of shopping and retail advertising.

There are also group sessions which additionally look at Debt and Benefits advice; and there are opportunities to do taste tests, which allow customers make better choices by sampling some of Tesco's own brands compared to generic branded foods.

Families benefit in terms of maximising their income by making better choices, having more efficient spending power and therefore, more disposable income. This project provides the opportunity for families to bring about positive and lasting change!
