This month we've highlighted a project by Guardians of the Flame, an organisation that exists to transform conflict and prevent violence by promoting values of peace and reconciliation.

They used the screening of their film and Q&A sessions to explore the role tribal religion has played in fuelling sectarian violence in Northern Ireland.
