Covid-19 Update

The key priority of the NI Community Relations Council (NICRC) is the health and well-being of those we work with, our staff and their families. We also want to ensure that we continue to deliver our services as far as is possible in these unprecedented times. You will all be aware of the recent change to the government's guidance on Covid-19. Below we have set out the steps we are taking as a result of the guidance:

- Currently our office is closed. Our staff are working remotely and can be contacted by email or through our current office number: 028 9022 7500.
- All events organised by CRC have moved to online platforms. We will update this position when the government's guidance permits people to gather in numbers again.

Unholy War An East Belfast Story



Unholy War follows ordinary people caught up in the tumultuous events of East Belfast from 1920—22. It's a nuanced study in how the past has shaped the present.

The drama project from The Bright Umbrella Drama Company was funded through the Community Relations Council (CRC) Small Grants Scheme.

“This period of the history of East Belfast is not well known and yet the huge demographic shifts of the time and the political positions that were adopted still affect us today,” said artistic director Trevor Gill. “The broader challenge of the piece was to ask if we will learn from our past or are we condemned to make the same mistakes over and over again?”
