

Factsheet for Northern Ireland Coronavirus (COVID-19)



COVID-19 centres continue to open

GP-led centres have opened in Belfast, Dungannon and Banbridge. The first centre opened last week in Londonderry.

COVID-19 centres are **not testing facilities**. Patients **must** be referred by their GP or Out of Hours centre.

They are only for patients who are unwell, are suspected of having Covid-19 and require medical attention.

Further centres will open in Antrim, Coleraine, Newtownards, Lisburn, Downpatrick and Enniskillen. Read more: www.bit.ly/2UTIO2L

It's a difficult time for everyone, but for those who already suffer with anxiety or other mental health issues this may present new and difficult challenges.

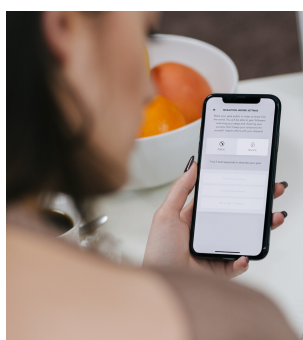

Surge planning steps up

Plans for the anticipated increase in COVID-19 patients requiring intensive care are underway. Hospitals have started to reconfigure their services to ensure hospital beds are available. Some of the main changes include:

- Belfast City Hospital's tower block transformed into Northern Ireland's first Nightingale Hospital.
- Closure of two hospital emergency departments - Daisy Hill Newry and Downe in Downpatrick
- The Downe's Minor Injuries Unit Day Procedure and outpatients unit will also temporarily close
- Development of more critical care beds at Altnagelvin and Ulster Hospital sites
- Assessment of the potential of the Eikon Centre at Balmoral Park, Maze as a second Nightingale hospital later this year.
- Plans are in place to protect children's and maternity services while releasing bed space to contribute to the overall surge response. There will be changes to the delivery of a number of services in coming days and weeks.
