

Performance Indicators in Higher Education: Employment

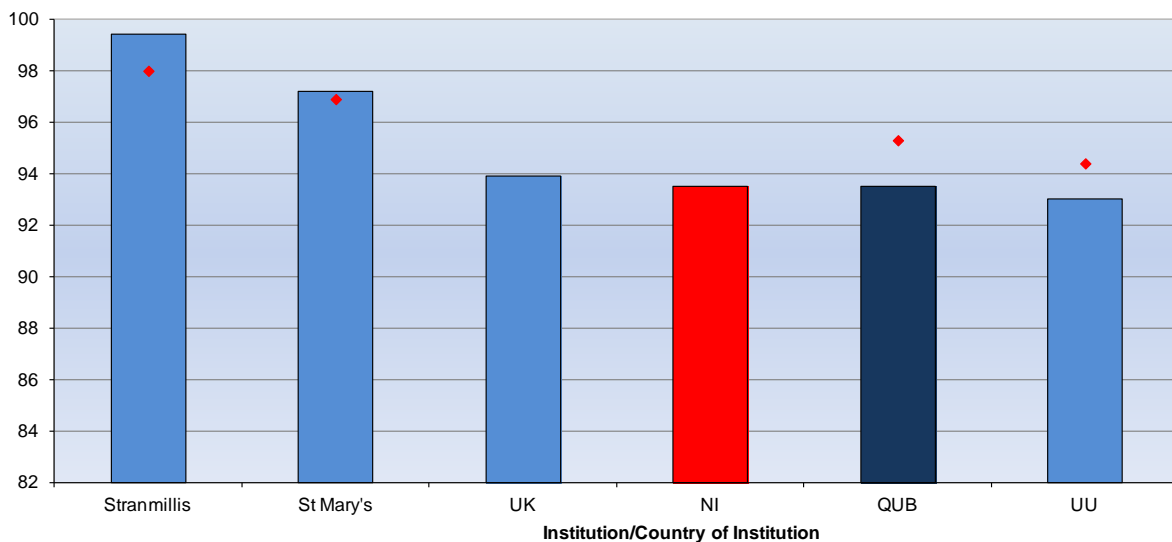
Employment Indicator - 2014/15 graduates – six months after graduation

This indicator expresses the number of graduates who are working or studying (or both) as a percentage of graduates who are working or studying (or both) or seeking work. Indicators are provided by level and mode of study.

Differences between institutions, such as subject mix or the qualifications on entry of their students, make comparisons between institutions unreliable. For this reason, benchmarks against which an institution’s value can be compared have been produced. For this indicator, a value higher than the benchmark indicates that an institution is performing well. Benchmarks are shown by a red diamond in Figure 1.

(a) Full-time first degree graduates¹ (Table 1, Figure 1)

Figure 1: Number of full time first degree graduates in work or study (or both) as a percentage of full time first degree graduates in work or study (or both) or seeking work - 2014/15



- Of the full-time first degree graduates from Northern Ireland (NI) Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in 2014/15 who were in work and/or study or seeking work, 93.5% (93.7% in 2013/14) were in work and/or study. The comparable figure for United Kingdom (UK) HEIs is 93.9% (93.2% in 2013/14);

- St Mary's – 97.2% (benchmark – 96.9%) and Stranmillis – 99.4% (benchmark – 98.0%) were performing above, but not significantly¹ above, their benchmarks;
- QUB – 93.5% (benchmark – 95.3%) and Ulster University (UU) – 93.0% (benchmark – 94.4%) were performing below, but not significantly below, their benchmarks. The Open University (OU) (NI campuses) did not have a percentage for this indicator, as all entrants during 2014/15 were part-time.

(b) Part-time first degree graduates¹

- Of the part-time first degree graduates from NI HEIs in 2014/15 who were in work and/or study or seeking work, 93.6% were in work and/or study six months after graduation. The comparable UK figure is 95.8%.
- QUB – 89.3% (benchmark – 93.2%), Stranmillis – 96.0% (benchmark – 98.6%), UU – 95.2% (benchmark – 97.0%) and OU (NI campuses) – 92.9% (benchmark – 96.2%) were performing below, but not significantly below, their benchmarks. Due to small numbers this measure was not produced for St Mary's.

(c) Full-time other undergraduates¹

- Of the full-time other undergraduates from NI HEIs in 2014/15 who were in work and/or study or seeking work, 91.7% were in work and/or study six months after graduation. The comparable UK figure is 94.8%.
- Stranmillis – 97.6% (benchmark – 94.9%) were performing above, but not significantly above, their benchmark.

- QUB – 83.9% (benchmark – 91.0%) were performing below, but not significantly below their benchmarks. Due to small numbers this measure was not produced for St Mary’s and OU (NI campuses), and due to a low response rate this measure was not produced for UU.

(d) Part-time other undergraduates

- Of the part-time other undergraduates from NI HEIs in 2014/15 who were in work and/or study or seeking work, 97.7% were in work and/or study six months after graduation. The comparable UK figure is 97.5%.
- UU – 98.4% (benchmark – 98.2%) were performing slightly above, but not significantly above, their benchmark.
- Stranmillis – 97.1% (benchmark – 97.5%) and OU (NI campuses) – 93.1% (benchmark – 96.0%) were performing below, but not significantly below, their benchmarks. Due to small numbers this measure was not produced for QUB and St Mary’s.
