This Statistical Factsheet, which is published three times a year (along with a more detailed annual bulletin), presents key information on employment vacancies which have been notified to the Department for Communities (DfC). The statistics presented here do not relate to the total unsatisfied demand for staff by employers, but to only those vacant positions that have been notified by employers to DfC.

In the third quarter (October to December) of the 2021/22 financial year there were 22,530 vacancies notified to DfC, a decrease of 2,334 (-9%) from the previous quarter (the second quarter of 2021/22). It should be noted that seasonality factors can affect vacancy trends and quarter three is traditionally the quarter which experiences the lowest number of vacancies notified to the Department. The 22,530 figure represents the highest total for the third quarter of any financial year since the current time series began in 2014/15.



Standard Occupational Classification 29% of Vacancies are for 'Personal Service Occupation' positions e.g. healthcare and related services, childcare, hairdressers.

Standard Industrial Classification

28% of Vacancies are for 'Administrative and Support Service' activities e.g. office administrative and support activities, temporary employment agency activities, activities of call centres.





Northern Ireland Multiple Deprivation Measure 29% of Vacancies are in the most

deprived 20% of areas in Northern Ireland.

Northern Ireland Jobs & Benefits Office Shaftesbury Square J&BO had the highest number of notified vacancies,

accounting for 11% of the Northern Ireland total.





Comparison with Previous Quarter



Type of Vacancy

Of the 22,530 vacancies notified to DfC in quarter three (October to December) 2021/22:



14,851 are full-time vacancies (66%)

5,506 are part-time vacancies (24%)

2,173 are casual vacancies (10%)


Note- Percentages may not sum to 100 due to rounding.

In Quarter Three 2021/22, 66% of vacancies were full-time, while 24% relate to part-time and 10% representing casual vacancies. The proportionate breakdown has changed slightly from the previous quarter (Quarter Two 2021/22) which recorded 68% full-time positions, 26% part-time and 7% casual.



Standard Occupational Classification

The chart opposite presents the Standard Occupational Classification 2000 (SOC 2000), used to organise vacancies notified to DfC into job groups according to skill level and skill specialisation. Personal Service Occupations involve the provision of a service to customers, whether in a public protective or personal capacity (e.g. health care occupations, childcare occupations, leisure & travel occupations, hairdressers)



Standard Industrial Classification

In this section the Standard Industrial Classification 2007 (SIC 2007) is used to organise vacancies notified to DfC by the type of economic activity in which they are engaged into twenty one categories. Vacancies are assigned the SIC 2007 code of the employer that notified them. Further information, including definitions, relating to the SIC 2007 can be found in the Notes to Readers.

The top 5 industrial classifications make up 83% (18,776) of the total number of vacancies notified in this quarter.





Northern Ireland Jobs & Benefit Offices

Notified vacancies are presented here by J&BO which the employer account vacancy is assigned to. The purpose is not to rank J&BOs by the number of notified vacancies, but rather to gain an understanding of the spread of notified vacancies at a local level. Vacancies assigned to Lisnagelvin J&BO are coded under Foyle J&BO on Client Management System (CMS); they are therefore grouped together in this publication.




In the third quarter of the 2021/22 financial year the J&BOs with the largest numbers of vacancies were; Shaftesbury Square with 2,402 (11%), Belfast North with 2,034 (9%), Ballymena with 1,769 (8%), Antrim with 1,524 (7%) and Newtownards with 1,418 (6%).



Northern Ireland Multiple Deprivation Measure

The NI Deprivation
Measure (2017) divides
Northern Ireland into 890
super output areas. Each
area is assigned a rank
according to its level of
deprivation, 1 being the
most deprived and 890
the least. Further

In the third quarter of the 2021/22 financial year 29% of vacancies were listed in the 20% most deprived areas while 17% of vacancies were located in the 20% least deprived areas.
