

FOAS MEMBERSHIP FEE INCREASE JUNE 2024



Membership fees were last increased in May 2021 and since then have remained static with FQAS utilising reserves over recent years to avoid an increase in producer fee. Scheme reserves are now at a level where they cannot be depleted any further, therefore, to continue supporting the efficient running of the scheme, the FQAS Industry Board has decided that a membership fee increase must now be applied to ensure long-term sustainability. LMC is guided by farmers, processors and independent experts who make up the FQAS Industry Board ensuring that FQAS evolves in line with relevant industry changes.

This increase in producer membership fees has been accompanied by a 20 per cent increase in the FQAS processor throughput fee. These additional funds will help to further the work of the scheme ensuring that ongoing operational costs are met. FQAS continues to be a baseline requirement for retailer sourcing and remains essential for gaining market access.

Deadweight Cattle Trade

Prime cattle throughput in NI plants last week totalled 8,073 head, an increase of 1,419 head from the previous week when 6,654 prime cattle were slaughtered locally. Increased levels of local cattle coming forward for slaughter accounted for this increased production last week, up by 1,381 head week on week. Meanwhile, imports of prime cattle from ROI for direct slaughter increased 38 head last week to total 363 prime cattle. Cow throughput locally also increased by 28 head last week to total 1,926 head, while ROI cow imports declined 14 head on the previous week to total 136 head.

Last week in NI the deadweight cattle trade improved overall with steers being the only category to report a softening. The plants have indicated the increased availability of all types of prime cattle as a key factor behind the softer trade for steers. The trade for clean beef is expected to be back early next week.

The R3 steer price in NI last week was back half a penny to 484.2p/kg. Meanwhile the average steer price in NI last week was back by a penny to 475.5p/kg. The R3 heifer price in NI last week was unchanged from the previous week at 484.6p/kg while the average heifer price was up just over half a penny to 477.6p/kg. The deadweight trade for young bulls firmed in NI last week with the R3 price up by 4.1p/kg to 473.2p/kg while the average young bull price was up by 1.1p/kg to 461.3p/kg.

Sheep Trade

The deadweight sheep trade firmed this week with quotes for R3 grade lambs ranging from 810 - 830p/kg and plants paying up to 21kg. This week saw local processors calling on producers to present outstanding fat hoggets for slaughter with spring lambs accounting for 50 per cent of the local prime sheep kill last week. Throughput of hoggets/lambs in NI plants last week totalled 5,808 head, up 899 head from the previous week. Meanwhile, this was a 33 per cent or 2,858 head decline compared to 8,666 head processed during the corresponding week last year.

Exports of hoggets/lambs to ROI for direct slaughter increased 868 head last week however direct slaughter exports to ROI remain at low levels in line with seasonal trends with 3,224 head exported in total. Demand from the GB market continues with last week being the second consecutive week a GB buyer sourced spring lambs for direct slaughter locally, exporting a consignment of 362 head last week compared to 575 head the week previous. Tight supplies continue to drive a record sheep trade across NI, GB and ROI with this seasons spring lambs being slow to reach slaughter weights. The average deadweight lamb price in NI last week was up 10.4p/kg to 801.7p/kg while in ROI the average deadweight lamb price last week was up 9.2p/kg to 786.9/kg.
