PPN 03/21 Supply Chain Resilience

The Covid-19 pandemic highlighted the fragile nature of supply chains in a global demand market and a need to improve the resilience of supply chains to provide security of supply. In developing the tender documents for these procurements and successive contracts, CPD and the participating clients focused on embedding supply chain resilience.

This was achieved in the following ways:

- Tenderers were required to demonstrate how they would manage supply chain risk to ensure stability, continuity and consistency of quality supply
- Tenderers were also required to include their sourcing strategies, length of supply chains, and any other measures and processes in place to mitigate against and minimise disruption as a result of for example further waves of COVID and EU Exit issues and what contingency logistics will be in place to ensure supply

Project title: ID 4670174 DoF – Collaborative Arrangement Supply and Delivery of Garage Sundries

Supplies and Services Division (SSD) facilitated the competition for a Contractor to replenish all Garage Sundry product stockholdings on a regular basis. The Clients store staff created a 'shopping-list' of stock-type products to be delivered direct to the relevant store within Northern Ireland.

In 2024 Truck Bus & Trailer Components Ltd were awarded the contract. Contract clients include: - NICS Departments, their Agencies and Non-Departmental Public Bodies (NDPBs), and several Centres of Procurement Expertise (CoPEs).

The contract commenced on 1st April 2024, and was awarded for an initial period of 4

years with an award value of approx. £3.6m.

Project title: ID 4896413 – DoF – Collaborative Arrangement – Supply and Delivery of Vehicle Spare Parts 2024 – 2028

Supplies and Services Division (SSD) facilitated the competition for a Contractor to Supply and Delivery of Vehicle Spare Parts to various locations throughout Northern Ireland.

In 2024 Engine & Truck (N.I.) Ltd, J.N.K. Components Ltd and NI Trucks Ltd Truck Bus & Trailer Components Ltd were awarded the contract. Contract clients include: - NICS Departments, their Agencies and Non-Departmental Public Bodies (NDPBs), and several Centres of Procurement Expertise (CoPEs).

The contract commenced on 26th February 2024, and was awarded for an initial period of 2 years with an optional 24 month extension with an award value of approx. £3.6m.
