Outcome indicators

Upper Springfield / Whiterock NRA

The Upper Springfield / Whiterock Neighbourhood Renewal Area (NRA) had a total population of 11,071 in 2016, of which approximately 62% are of working age. There were 5% of residents who identified their 'religion or religion brought up in' as 'Protestant and Other Christian (including Christian related)', while approximately 93% identified their 'religion or religion brought up in' as Catholic.

Benefit uptake within Upper Springfield / Whiterock NRA remains higher than non-NRAs. When compared to other NRAs it has the highest percentage of Disability Living Allowance claimants and the second highest percentage of Pension Credit claimants.

The education indicators relating to GCSE achivement have seen a positive change to the gap. The percentage of school leavers with 5 or more GCSEs which has more than doubled since 2004/05.

The proportions of deaths to under 75s, deaths due to alcohol and deaths due to suicide and undetermined intent in Upper Springfield / Whiterock NRA have all increased compared with 2003 leading to a widening of the gap to non-NRAs. In contrast, the proportion of births to teenage mothers has more than halved.

Overall crime levels within Upper Springfield / Whiterock NRA have increased since 2003, with increased being recorded across most of the categories of crime. The exceptions are reductions in the level of anti social behaviour incidents and criminal damage incidents per 1,000 population.

Purpose

Regardless of where a deprived area is located it will inherently have similar problems. For example, higher than average rates of unemployment, physical and mental ill health, lower levels of educational attainment, higher rates of crime and problems with quality and maintenance of the environment.

The main aim of the Neighbourhood Renewal Strategy is to close the gap in the quality of life between the most deprived neighbourhoods and the rest of society.

The statistical indicators presented here provide evidence on the absolute change that is being recorded across the key Neighbourhood Renewal outcomes, and whether there have been positive or negative movements over time in statistical data in relation to:

- a. Worklessness;
- b. Education;
- c. Health, and
- d. Crime and anti-social behaviour.

Where possible the data presented has been updated to reflect the publication of new data for additional years. In some cases however, such as for a number of the education indicators, this has not been possible as data is not available for Neighbourhood Renewal Areas (NRAs).

The Neighbourhood Renewal Code of Practice and Guiding Principles states that one of the responsibilities of the Neighbourhood Renewal Partnership is to develop and agree an Area Action Plan which seeks to improve the social, economic and environmental conditions by amongst others:

- identifying evidence based needs, and
- prioritising the needs of the area that are to be met.

The purpose of the information presented here is to provide an evidence base for the area to enable staff and members of the partnerships to identify and prioritise need. The information highlights, across a number of key economic and social outcomes, if the gap is closing.

The findings presented here along with the Area's Annual Report should be reflected upon when taking forward the annual review of the Action Plan as well as considering the effectiveness of the projects/interventions being supported in contributing to closing the gap.

User Notes

- i. The information is broadly split into two parts:
- Gap Analysis Table and Summary
- Measuring of impact across each Key Outcome Indicator.

The Gap Analysis table and Summary provide a high level data across the key indicators on whether the Neighbourhood Renewal Area (NRA) has experienced a positive or negative outcome or if there has been relatively little change. The table allows the user to compare the NRA and Non NRAs baseline position and the most current year available. The colour blocking shows whether the indicator has improved (green), not changed (yellow) or deteriorated (red) when the most recent year available is compared with the baseline position. The final column in the table shows whether the gap between the NRA and Non NRAs has widened (red arrow), is unchanged (yellow arrow) or had narrowed (green arrow).


The measuring of the individual key outcome indicators provides data on a year by year basis across a given period. This information allows the user to examine the trend and variances and consider if there has been any outside influences, for example, the economic downturn.

- ii. Care should be taken when interpreting a positive or negative outcome as the NRA may still be experiencing significant problems improving but still significantly behind Non NRAs.
- iii. Given the changes in the provision of welfare, some key indicators are reporting a closing of the gap. This may be due to changes in the rules for claiming particular benefits and the migration to new benefits, for example, some claimants might be transferred to Employment and Support Allowance if they have been claiming other benefits like Income Support or Incapacity Benefit.
- iv. Caution is advised when interpreting change over time where numbers are small. This is particularly evident when examining our smaller NRAs. The Demography section of this report provides information relating to the population size and breakdown.

Please note that some trend data has been revised since the last NR Outcome Indicator report with the data presented here the most up-to-date available. This is particularly the case for the crime data.




