#### a) Name of the policy

Amendment to building regulations to require the provision of inbuilding physical infrastructure to facilitate the provision of high speed electronic communications networks.

#### b) Brief Description of the policy

The policy will require the provision of accessible ductwork or other suitable "in-building physical infrastructure" for broadband for new buildings and where major renovation works to existing "in-building physical infrastructure" takes place.

# c) Aims of the policy/ Rationale behind the changes

The policy intends to ensure that new buildings are provided with accessible ductwork or other suitable "in-building physical infrastructure" for high-speed broadband in accordance with Article 8 of Directive 2014/61/EU. (The remainder of the Directive is implemented at a UK level through Department of Culture Media and Sport.) The directive is intended to reduce the cost of deployment of high speed broadband networks across the EU.

# d) Who will the policy affect?

The policy will affect people constructing new buildings and those carrying out major renovation works to a building's existing "inbuilding physical infrastructure".
