The vision is surprising brief and, while it states important principles, a Vision is expected to describe the council's ambition for the Council area in more length.

There is great emphasis on sustainability and that is to be welcomed. However I feel more needs to be said about Sustainability Transport and Active Travel in the Vision. How will they "reduce the need to travel and increase use of sustainable forms of transport"? It needs a bolder statement.

Public transport and active travel connections need to be embedded in the planning process. Similar to the requirements of the Active Travel Bill in Wales.

Development proposals should demonstrate how sustainable transport (and active travel are acknowledged and provided for within and around the development site (for example, how does the housing development connect with the local schools, shops and Leisure Centre).

Positive planning with sustainable transport and active travel will reduce car journeys and promote active travel and help make public transport viable.

This could be included in any or all of the three pillars of sustainability or simply be part of the overall vision.

The Strategic Objectives are clear and comprehensive. In particular, the objective on the environment identifies and describes succinctly the need to improve the quality of the natural and built environment

The options presented in the Preferred Option Paper are strategic and whilst Option 3 is the preferred option in allocating housing numbers between Omagh and Enniskillen; the towns, villages and small settlements; and the countryside, it seems unbalanced to allocate 3114 houses to Enniskillen and Omagh as the main hubs and drivers to attract employment and provide higher order services, and 1407 houses to the countryside. The 2011 census showed that only 33% of households were within the two main hubs of Enniskillen and Omagh whilst 40.6% were in the countryside and 26.4% within the smaller towns, villages and smaller settlements.
Whilst the surge of speculative single houses in the countryside during 2004-2006 has tapered off, the allocation of 1407 houses in the countryside takes away from the consolidation of small towns, villages and small settlements, many of which are sprawling settlements of private and semi-detached housing dominated by roads. The maintenance of 26.4% of the housing allocation (1370 houses) for smaller towns, villages and small settlements in the three options provides the housing stock to provide for good design, connectivity and linkage with the development of brown field sites within development limits.
We feel that none of the option's take account of improving the settlements that are already in place and we would welcome the opportunity to discuss this further.

We would welcome the opportunity to discuss this in further detail with you to discuss the proportion of the countryside. Option 2 is the preferred option, subject to the following comments:
Whilst separate industrial / business parks, that have synergies from the grouping of different uses, are suitable for larger settlements, there is potential in the Fermanagh and Omagh Council area for small business to be developed to take advantage of the landscape, history and agriculture of the area such as food production; fishing and shooting; water skiing; genealogy; history; holiday accommodation.
Many business uses are compatible with housing and with the surrounding rural area. Use Classes that are compatible with housing areas, Class B1 (b) call centre; B1 (c) research and development; B2 light industry can be located close to housing or in housing areas in small settlements. These locations reduce the need to travel to work by car and have access by greenways with pedestrian and cycle ways.

MAG are broadly in agreement with Option three but suggest the following should be taken into consideration and once again would welcome the opportunity to discuss further with you:
 The beneficial impacts of good standards of civic stewardship, design and place making including landscaping, are particularly important in areas of low employment or multi-deprivation to reinforce social and economic efforts to attract private and public investment.
 Good design of the built environment is an essential component in delivering quality and maximizing the beneficial use of finance to deliver the spatial aspects of social and economic initiatives with the involvement of local communities.
 In addition to the designated areas identified by the council with particular emphasis on Design and Place making,
 The principles could also be included in the Good Design and place making section. Current "Active Travel" provision should be audited/mapped and an overall plan for the future development of active travel including the Greenway Strategy should be set out as a guide to place making and design (masterplanning).
The inclusion to limit the weight given to precedent is particularly welcome to ensure that judgment of good design is not restricted to precedent of location and form.
