



Figure 2 - Population per 100 ha of Utilised Agricultural Area (UAA), 2016





Figure 4 - Proportion of gross turnover by subsector in NI, 2016




Figure 5 - Proportion of employee jobs by Industry section, December 2017



Figure 6 - Trend in dairy and beef cow numbers, NI, 2002 - 2017





Figure 8 - Full-time labour on NI farms, 1997, 2007 and 2015 - 2017



Figure 9 - Estimated value of recorded landings of fish into NI, 2008 - 2017


