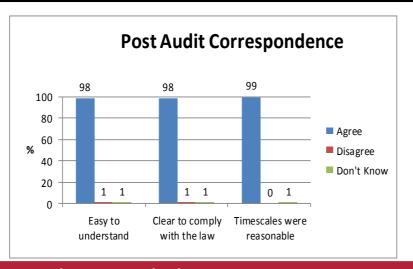
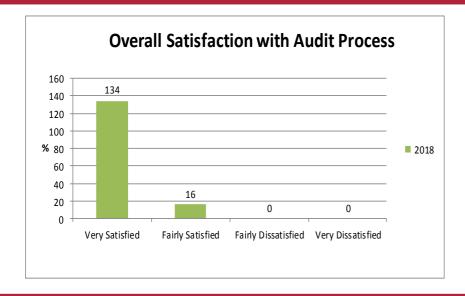
OVERALL

PREVENTION & PROTECTION FIRE SAFETY AUDIT SURVEY 2018

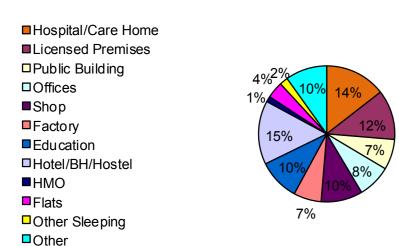


INTRODUCTION

Northern Ireland Fire & Rescue Service (NIFRS) conducted its Fire Safety Audit Survey during the months of January and February 2018. A questionnaire was issued to a sample of 500 businesses and organisations across Northern Ireland which recently had a fire safety audit carried out on their premises. The Prevention & Protection Department carried out this survey to allow our fire safety audit process to be assessed and, on this occasion, received a 30% response rate.

The type of business/organisation to return the survey is broken down in the following chart:

Property Inspected

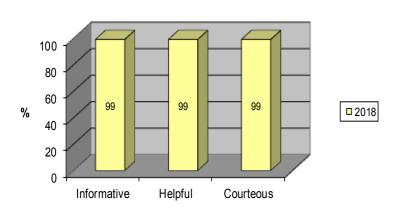

When asked about the length of time it took NIFRS to carry out the audit following our request, respondents answered:

46%	within 1 working day
17%	within 2-5 working days
23%	within 1-2 weeks
12%	within 3-4 weeks
2%	more than 4 weeks

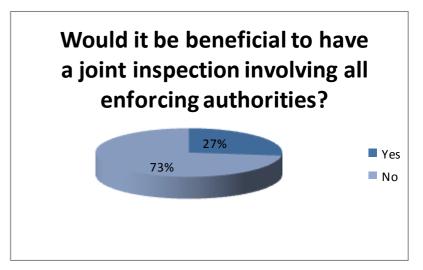
Respondents were asked questions about the Fire Safety Inspectors in

attendance at their premises and how they felt the Inspectors dealt with

the appointment. The overall consensus continues to be very positive

as indicated in the following chart:

97% of respondents stated that the same Fire Safety Inspector dealt with them throughout the inspection process.



99% of visit:

Survey respondents were given four options to choose in relation to their most recent audit. They were asked was the visit:

- 1 Requested by NIFRS to comply with legislation? 78%
- 2 As a result of a fire incident at the premises? 7%
- Following a complaint regarding the premises? 3%
- 4 Other? 12%
