





Your response, and all other responses to the consultation, may be disclosed on request. The Freedom of Information Act gives the public a right of access to any information held by a public authority, namely, the Department in this case. EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS

Section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998 requires the Department to "have due regard" to the need to promote equality of opportunity between persons of different religious belief, political opinion, racial group, age, marital status or sexual orientation; between men and women generally; between persons with a disability and persons without; and between persons with dependants and persons without. The Department is also required to 'have regard' to the desirability of promoting good relations between persons of a different religious belief, political opinion or racial group.

In keeping with the above statutory obligations and in accordance with guidance produced by the Equality Commission for Northern Ireland, the Department has carried out a preliminary equality screening exercise to determine if the draft standards are likely to have a significant impact on equality of opportunity and should therefore be subjected to an Equality Impact Assessment (EQIA). However if issues arise as part of the consultation, this position will be revised accordingly. The Department has concluded that an EQIA is not appropriate for a number of reasons including:

- The preliminary screening and engagement with key stakeholders to date has shown no evidence of any adverse impact on the different groups;
- The draft standards are intended to set a transparent and consistent benchmark for the quality of these services, which will benefit all those who use and provide these services.
