# **LMC PROVIDES MARKET INFORMATION SERVICES FOR 50 YEARS**

VER the past year the Livestock and Meat Commission for Northern Ireland (LMC) has marked a total of three major milestones. Firstly, the 50th anniversary of the commission, the 25th anniversary of the Northern Ireland Beef and Lamb Farm Quality Assurance Scheme (NIBL FQAS), which is managed by LMC and finally the 50th anniversary of LMC's weekly Market Information Bulletin.

The LMC Bulletin, which is currently on its 2,500 edition, was first published on Wednesday December 20, 1967 and has been published weekly ever since. The livestock industry in NI has changed markedly in NI since the

Bulletin was first published in 1967. There are now 60 per cent more dairy cows, 50 per cent more beef cows and 65 per cent more ewes on NI farms than there were 50 years ago.

The LMC Bulletin is a key component of LMC's Market Information Services and allows readers to keep up-to-date with the latest trends in the beef and lamb markets and provides information to support, examine and inform the Northern Ireland red meat industry. The publication continues to be a useful resource for all LMC's producer and processor levy pavers as well as wider beef and lamb industry stakeholders in NI.

Speaking about the service, LMC Economist, Seamus McMenamin said: "The LMC Bulletin aspires to support producers and processors with their decision making by providing accurate and timely information that creates a better understanding of the trade. LMC is committed to creating an environment where our stakeholders are well informed, whether this is through the provision of basic statistics, further analysis/examination of data or the delivery of information through LMC supported conferences.

The LMC Bulletin was initially printed and posted to all stakeholders on a weekly basis and provided a summary or overview of the beef and sheep trade across NI. Over time the LMC Bulletin evolved and included articles and detailed data on issues that would be useful to LMC stakeholders.

Following some independent market

research with users of LMC's market information services the decision was made to cease posting out the publication and instead partner with the farming press to facilitate distribution and increase readership. The LMC Bulletin has been published weekly in partnership with the Farming Life since January 2012. The publication is also hosted on the LMC website and emailed out to over 2,000 email subscribers every week.

While the LMC Bulletin continues to play a key role in the delivery of market information to the beef and sheep meat industries the services which LMC's Market Information Department provide have adapted and changed over time in with industry needs and line developments in communications.

To complement the LMC Bulletin the LMC Ouarterly is published four times annually and provides the opportunity for further in depth analysis into key market information issues. This is posted to over 12,000 subscribers. emailed out to over 2,000 email subscribers and hosted on the LMC website.

As well as providing a platform for LMC publications the LMC website also provides a valuable source of up to date information for the NI beef and sheep meat industry in the form of base quotes, prices and basic statistics. This is updated daily as new information becomes available.

LMC's Market Information Department also provides a range of other services to our stakeholders including a bespoke

#### **Deadweight Cattle Trade**

Base quotes held steady at 350-356p/kg for U-3 grade in spec steers and heifers from the major processing plants this week. Quotes for cows have also remained steady, ranging from 260-280p/kg across the plants with the majority of plants quoting in the region of 270p/kg. Similar quotes are expected for all types of cattle next Wednesday when the plants re-open for business.

The plants have reported strong supplies of prime cattle coming forward to meet demand for beef. Prime cattle throughput in NI last week totalled 6,956 head, up by 69 head from the previous week. In the corresponding week in 2016 prime cattle throughput in local plants totalled 6,678 head. Cow throughput in NI last week totalled 2,306 head, back 247 head from the previous week. In the same week in 2016 cow throughput in local plants totalled 2,312 head.

Imports and exports of cattle for direct slaughter have continued but at relatively low levels. Last week 16 prime cattle and 29 cows were imported from ROI for direct slaughter in local plants with a further 2 prime cattle and 103 cows imported from GB. Meanwhile 40 prime cattle, 112 cows and 13 bulls were exported from NI to ROI for direct slaughter last week while exports to GB consisted of 99 prime cattle and 26 cows.

The deadweight trade for prime cattle in NI last week came under slight pressure with the prices paid for majority of reported grades back marginally from the previous week. The average steer price was back by 1.3p/kg to 350.4p/kg in NI last week however the R3 steer price increased marginally to 361.4p/kg. In the corresponding week last year the R3 steer price in NI was 355p/kg. The average heifer price in NI last week was back by just under a penny to 351.9p/kg while the average heifer price was unchanged at 359.9p/kg. There was a strong increase in the average cow price in NI last week, up by 5.3p/kg to 257.9p/kg.

In GB last week the deadweight trade for prime cattle continued to come under pressure. The average steer in GB price last week was back by half a penny to 363.3p/kg while the R3 steer price was back by 1.8p/kg to 373p/kg. There was however some variation across the regions with the R3 steer price in the Midlands holding steady while it was back by between 2-4p/kg in the other regions. The average heifer price in GB last week was back by 1.8p/kg to 364.3p/kg while the R3 heifer price was back by 2.5p/kg to 373.4p/kg. The R3 price was back in all the GB regions with the most notable decrease in Scotland where it was back by 4.2p/kg to 380.3p/kg.

The deadweight trade improved in ROI last week with reported prices up for all types of cattle. The R3 steer price increased by the equivalent of 4.8p/kg to 342.6p/kg while the R3 heifer price was up by 4.4p/kg to 353.1p/kg. This puts the differential with NI at 18.8p/kg for R3 grade steers and 6.8p/kg for R3 grade heifers. The O3 cow price in ROI increased by 2.4p/kg to 285p/kg last week, putting it 8.7p/kg higher than the equivalent price in NI.

#### Deadweight Sheep Trade

**B** ASE quotes for R3 grading lambs held steady this week at 385-390p/kg up to 22kg across the major processing plants with similar quotes expected for next week. The plants have reported good supplies to meet demand for lamb with throughput in NI last week totalling 8,179 head. This was back 892 head from the previous weeks which accounts for a ten per cent decline. Lamb exports to from NI to ROI for direct slaughter last week totalled 8,530 head, also back ten per cent from the previous week. The average liveweight price in NI last week was 358.1p/kg, up 5.7p/kg from the previous week while the average deadweight price in NI was 384.7p/kg last week, back marginally from the previous week.

#### This week's marts

THE trade in the marts this week held steady with the number of lambs passing through the sale rings similar to the same time last year. A steady demand for good quality lambs has been reported across the marts. In Kilrea on Monday 380 lambs sold from 343-373p/kg compared to 200 lambs last week selling from 358-379p/kg. In Saintfield this week 703 lambs sold from 350-400p/kg. This was similar to last week when 505 lambs sold from 346-400p/kg. In Rathfriland this week 534 lambs sold to an average of 358p/kg compared to 540 lambs last week selling to an average of 356p/kg. There were small numbers of cull ewes passing through the marts this week with top reported prices generally ranging from £90-100.
