Revision to Judicial Statistics 2015 and Judicial Statistics 2016

This statistical notice informs users of a revision to Table B11: Queen's Bench writs and originating summonses set-down by amount claimed and Table B16: Queens Bench commercial actions set-down, published in Judicial Statistics 2015 and Judicial Statistics 2016. These reports were originally published at 9.30am on Friday 24th June 2016 and Friday 30th June 2017 respectively.

In summary, the revisions are:

- Queen's Bench writs and originating summonses set-down published in Table B11 being revised from 697 to 950 in Judicial Statistics 2015 and from 167 to 842 in Judicial Statistics 2016. A technical error within the administrative court recording system caused the incorrect identification of the Writs setdown for hearing.
- Queen's Bench commercial actions set-down published in Table B16 being revised from 105 to 111 in Judicial Statistics 2015 and from 71 to 78 in Judicial Statistics 2016. A technical error within the administrative court recording system caused the incorrect identification of the Writs set-down for hearing.
- 3. An amended back series of data from 2010 to 2016 has also been published via the link below. The technical error first occurred back in 2010 however the impact on the earlier years' data has been less significant and so the original publications have not been revised.
