



PERCEPTION AND AWARENESS OF PEACE 4 AND INTERREG 5A PROGRAMMES

**RESULTS MARCH 2018** 



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#### **METHODOLOGY & SAMPLE**

In conducting this research a telephone methodology was employed. The fieldwork began on the 1<sup>st</sup> of December 2017 and concluded on the 9th March 2018. The 7-8 minute questionnaire was designed in conjunction with the Special EU Programmes Body. (Full questionnaire can be found in the appendix).

Throughout the fieldwork period, Millward Brown interviewers worked under direct supervision, with approximately 10% of all interviews being monitored by the Call Centre manager using remote 'listening in' facilities. This process ensures that the quality and consistency of interviewing is maintained at all times, fully complying with the standards enshrined within IQCS (Interviewer Quality control Scheme). During each shift interviewers provided feedback on an ongoing basis, so any issues arising could be resolved and dealt with in real time.

The survey comprised of a total sample of 750 general public respondents across the three areas specified – Northern Ireland (NI), border counties in Ireland and Western Scotland. To ensure the sample structure was consistent with the survey conducted in previous years, the sample was broken down accordingly – Northern Ireland n=450 / border counties in Ireland n=150 / western Scotland n=150.

This general population survey was complemented by a telephone survey conducted amongst 50 approved stakeholders of the programmes. The stakeholder sample incorporated:

- 10 involved with PEACE 4
- > 10 involved with INTERREG 5A
- 10 Monitoring and Steering Committee Members
- 10 MPs / MLAs / MEPs/TDs/MSPs
- 10 Councillors

NB: Throughout the report if any figures do not add up to 100% this is due to 'don't knows' being excluded from the data.

2018 findings are trended with previous years. However, as the data sets collected in previous years would have been based on the PEACE III and INTERREG IVA programmes the findings are not directly comparable but have been included for reference. Please note that some of these bases are quite small and therefore should be treated with a hint of caution.

## 2. ANALYSIS OF SAMPLE


The sample in each area was fully representative of the individual adult populations (16+), with stratifications being carefully constructed using official government census information. Full geographical representation was included throughout Northern Ireland as a whole, as well as in the border counties in Ireland and the western Scotland counties. A proportionate number of interviews were conducted by county, in keeping with the population in each.

In Northern Ireland, the sample consisted of more females than males (56% vs. 44%) and more 35+ year olds than the younger age groups of 16-34 year olds (66% vs. 33%). In terms of social class<sup>1</sup>, the sample consisted of more ABC1's than C2DE's (58% vs. 42%).

Analysis of Sample – Northern Ireland





<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The social class of a respondent is determined by the skill level and managerial responsibility of their occupation. The social classes are split into the following groups: A, B, C1, C2, D and E. For comparative purposes, best practice suggests analysing social class by the groupings ABC1, C2 and DE.

In terms of social class, 41% of the border county sample were ABC1, while 59% were C2DEF (figure 2).

Analysis of Sample – Border Counties



In western Scotland, the sample breakdown was reversed to that of the border county with more people from an ABC1 background.


Analysis of Sample – Western Scotland

Figure 4 shows 54% of the stakeholders surveyed stated they had more involvement with PEACE 4, with 32% mentioning being involved with INTERREG 5A. Fourteen percent were involved with both programmes equally.






Which of these two programmes are you most involved in, or would you say you are involved with them both equally? [Base: Stakeholders respondents n=50]

# 3. AWARENESS OF SEUPB


Awareness of the Special EU Programmes Body was higher in the border counties (16%) than the other areas sampled. Among Northern Ireland residents, 14% (over 1 in 10) were aware of the Special EU Programmes Body. In Western Scotland, 4% (less than 1 in 20) were aware of the organisation (figure 5).

Eighty six percent of Northern Ireland respondents had not heard of the Special EU Programmes Body. This level has bounced back similar to 2014 and 2015 findings. In terms of age, unawareness appeared to be higher among the 16-24 (92%) and 25-34 age group (91%) and the socio-economic group C2DE (88%).



Figure 7 demonstrates that 84% (more than 4 in 5) of border county respondents had not heard of the Special EU Programmes Body.



In western Scotland, the proportion of those unaware of the Special EU Programmes Body had climbed back up to be similar to 2014 trends (96%). There was a slight increase of those claiming to be unaware amongst males (97%) and the socio economic grouping ABC1 (98%) (figure 8).

Have you ever heard of the Special EU Programmes Body?



## 4. PEACE 4 PROGRAMME

The PEACE 4 Programme is the EU Programme for Peace and Reconciliation in Northern Ireland and the Border Region of Ireland. The main aims of the programme include:

- The reinforcement of progress towards a peaceful and stable society
- To promote reconciliation by assisting operations and projects which help to reconcile communities and contribute towards a shared society for everyone.


Figure 9 reveals although awareness of the PEACE 4 programme was higher in the border counties than in Northern Ireland, awareness overall has decreased on 2017 findings.



In Northern Ireland, almost two in five were aware of PEACE 4 (39%). Awareness was lowest among the 16-24 age group (17%) and similar across both socio-economic groupings (figure 10).

Aware of PEACE 4 – Northern Ireland



Shown in Figure 11, amongst the border county respondents almost half (45%) were aware of the PEACE 4 programme. Awareness was fairly similar across gender (43% vs 48%); it was higher amongst ABC1 respondents (52%, compared to 41%).


Aware of PEACE 4 – Border Counties

Among those Northern Ireland respondents aware of the PEACE 4 programme, the three most commonly cited aims of the programme were to 'Better communication/cooperation across communities and/or borders', 'promote peace' and 'bringing people together'. Other aims cited are revealed in figure 12.



Of those border county respondents aware of the Peace 4 programme, the most commonly cited aims of the programme were 'Better communication/cooperation across communities and/or borders' and to 'promote peace'. Other aims cited are revealed in figure 13.

What PEACE 4 Aims to achieve – Border Counties



In terms of the perceived impact of PEACE 4 amongst Northern Ireland respondents, when 'don't knows' have been excluded from the base, around three quarters (74%) believed it was having a positive impact. A quarter (25%) believed it made no difference. There was minimal evidence to suggest the programme was perceived as having a negative impact (figure 14).


Impact of PEACE 4 – Northern Ireland

With 'don't knows' excluded from the base, a higher proportion of respondents from the border counties than Northern Ireland perceived PEACE 4 as having a positive impact (87% vs 74%). Similar to Northern Ireland there was no evidence to suggest the programme was perceived as having a negative impact (figure 15).

Impact of PEACE 4 – Border Counties





#### 5. INTERREG 5A PROGRAMME

The INTERREG 5A Programme for Northern Ireland, the Border Region of Ireland and western Scotland is a European Union supported Structural Funds Programme which attempts to address the economic and social problems which result from the existence of borders. It also supports strategic cross-border co-operation for a more prosperous and sustainable region.

Awareness of the INTERREG 5A programme although higher among those living in the border counties (21%) than in Northern Ireland (12%) or western Scotland (3%) has decreases on 2017 findings (figure 16).



In Northern Ireland, approaching 9 in 10 were unaware of INTERREG 5A (85%). Lack of awareness was highest among the 16-24 age group (97%) and the socio economic grouping C2DE (89%) (figure 17).





Amongst the border county respondents, over 3 in 4 were unaware of INTERREG 5A (77%). Lack of awareness was more prevalent amongst females (79%) and the socio economic grouping C2DE (83%) (figure 18).

Unaware of INTERREG 5A – Border Counties






Unaware of INTERREG 5A – Western Scotland





In terms of the perceived impact of INTERREG 5A amongst Northern Ireland respondents, when 'don't knows' have been excluded from the base, more than 3 in 5 (62%) believed the programme was having a positive impact. Around one third (34%) believed it made no difference. There was minimal evidence to suggest the programme was perceived as having a negative impact (figure 22).

Impact of INTERREG 5A - Northern Ireland



With 'don't knows' excluded from the base, a higher proportion of respondents from the border counties compared to Northern Ireland perceived INTERREG 5A as having a positive impact (85% vs 62%). Similar to Northern Ireland there was no evidence to suggest the programme was perceived as having a negative impact (figure 23).


# Impact of INTERREG IVA - Western Scotland

As awareness was low, only four respondents in Western Scotland commented on the impact of Interreg IVA, of which two had no opinion and two perceived the programme to have a positive impact.

## 6. FUNDED PROGRAMMES

Figure 24 demonstrates that awareness of funding to help promote cross border working and co-operation, and to encourage peace and reconciliation, was higher in Northern Ireland and border counties than in western Scotland. Around two-thirds of Northern Ireland (66%) and border county (65%) respondents were aware, compared to almost 1 in 6 (14%) in western Scotland. These awareness trends are similar to those found in 2015 for Northern Ireland and the Border counties.

Are you aware that Northern Ireland and the Border region of Ireland receive funding to help promote cross border working and co-operation, and to encourage peace and reconciliation?



Respondents aware of either PEACE 4 or INTERREG 5A were asked if they knew funding came from the European Union. Results revealed over 7 in 10 border county residents (72%) were aware, a slightly higher level of awareness compared to Northern Ireland residents (72%) Of the 4 western Scotland residents aware, all knew where the funding came from.

In slightly more detail, amongst Northern Ireland respondents, 66% were aware the PEACE 4 funding came from the EU and 64% were aware the INTERREG 5A funding came from the EU.




Respondents were asked to comment on the type of projects they perceived as receiving funding under PEACE 4 and INTERREG 5A. Figures 26 and 27 demonstrate the programmes the Northern Ireland residents believed benefit from funding. The most commonly cited were 'cross community programmes', 'community centres' and 'youth clubs'.

Type of projects that receive funding under INTERREG 5A Northern Ireland










Do you know the name of any other organisation which delivers PEACE 4 funding within your local area? [Base: NI Respondents n=450 / Border Counties respondents n=150]

Name of organisation delivering PEACE 4 funding – Border Counties Jan'2018






Awareness of organisation delivering INTERREG 5A funding with local area January 2018

Figure 34 Name of organisation delivering INTERREG 5A funding - Northern Ireland Jan' 2018





Name of organisation delivering INTERREG 5A funding - Border Counties Jan'2018





#### 7. PERCEIVED IMPACT OF EU FUNDING

Respondents aware of either programme were asked to rate the extent to which they agreed or disagreed that 'EU funding is making a positive difference to communities'. Among Northern Ireland residents 75% either strongly agreed or agreed (figure 37).

EU funding is making a positive difference to communities – Northern Ireland



Agreement with the statement 'EU funding is making a positive difference to communities' was higher among border county residents (87%) relative to those in Northern Ireland (75%). Among border county residents overall agreement had remained consistent on previous years (figure 38).

EU funding is making a positive difference to communities – Border Counties





In western Scotland, 62% either agreed or strongly agreed, 18% remained impartial and 21% either disagreed or strongly disagreed with the statement 'EU is making a positive difference to communities'.

Figure 39 shows the extent of agreement with the statement 'EU funding is investing in your future'. There was an overall level of agreement among 68% of Northern Ireland respondents.

EU funding is investing in your future – Northern Ireland



Overall agreement with the statement was higher across the border counties than in Northern Ireland (68%) with nearly 4 in 5 (79%) strongly agreeing or agreeing.

Figure 40 **EU** funding is investing in your future - Border Counties





In western Scotland, 54% either agreed or strongly agreed, 15% remained impartial, and 31% either disagreed or disagreed strongly with the statement 'EU funding is investing in your future'.

#### 8. FINDING OUT MORE

Figure 41 below demonstrates that very few people have received information about either PEACE 4 or INTERREG 5A. Those living in Northern Ireland (3%) were more likely to have received information than border counties (1%) residents. None of the Scottish residents claimed to have received any information.



Amongst Northern Ireland residents, there wasn't one core area respondents were interested in but rather showed interest in all areas equally. Aside from timescales, around 1 in 5 respondents showing interest in each of the key areas mentioned. More than three-fifths of respondents (62%) were not interested in receiving any additional information, in line with 2017 figures (64%).

Information most interested in receiving – Northern Ireland




Which of the following pieces of information would you be interested in receiving regarding these projects? [Base: NI respondents n=450]

Figure 43 reveals similar trends in the border counties to that of Northern Ireland when it comes to the areas respondents were interested in receiving information on, albeit proportions are lower in the border counties with around 1 in 10 showing interest in each area compared to 2 in 10 in Northern Ireland. Four-fifths (80%) did not have any interest in additional information, increasing by more than one-fifth since January 2017 (figure 43).

Information most interested in receiving – Border Counties




Which of the following pieces of information would you be interested in receiving regarding these projects? [Base: Border Counties respondents n=150]

The chart below (figure 44) reveals a gradual decline in interest between 2012 and 2017 among western Scotland respondents in relation to desired information. In 2018 there is a noticeable surge in interest levels across all areas.

#### 9. ACHIEVEMENT OF OBJECTIVES


The analysis of the stakeholders survey incorporates those involved with PEACE 4 and INTERREG 5A. As well as reporting on these results by all stakeholders additional analysis has also been done by each individual programme.

2018 findings are trended with previous years. However, as the data sets collected in previous years would have been based on the PEACE III and INTERREG IVA programmes the findings are not directly comparable but have been included for reference. Please note that some of these bases are quite small and therefore should be treated with a hint of caution.

Stakeholders were asked to rate the extent to which they agreed or disagreed that each of the programmes were meeting their objectives. Amongst those stakeholders involved with PEACE 4 50% (half) strongly agreed or agreed that PEACE 4 was achieving its objectives.

Extent of agreement – "I think PEACE 4 is achieving its objectives"




To what extent do you agree or disagree with statement: I think PEACE 4 is achieving its objectives [ Base: Stakeholders n=50 ]

Extent of agreement – "I think INTERREG 5A is achieving its objectives"




To what extent do you agree or disagree with statement: I think INTERREG 5A is achieving its objectives  $[Base: Stakeholders \, n=50\,]$ 

#### 10. SATISFACTION AMONG STAKEHOLDERS

Among all 50 stakeholders sampled, 60% (three-fifths) were either very satisfied or satisfied with the level of information they receive from Special EU Programmes Body. Satisfaction was higher among those involved with INTERREG 5A than those involved with PEACE 4 (65% vs. 56%) (figure 47).

Overall, only 7 stakeholders (14%) were either very dissatisfied or dissatisfied with the level of information received. The reasons cited for dissatisfaction included:


- No recent receipt of information
- ➤ In the absence of Stormont, each council area needs to have specially tailored information
- Unless you are on the committee you are reading from a transcript, instead of having one councillor on it, any councillor should be able to attend. Some of the right people are missing out on committee meetings and making a difference, it should be an open invitation to all. I feel that there is some bureaucracy involved and some people who are involved aren't really trying to help local communities.

- ➤ The level of the information is very generic and there is a level of information which you need to research yourself open to misinterpretation, not specific and not explicit enough
- Would like to be updated
- We've got a handful of bits of information. I think information should be available and elected members should be emailed to be kept up to date.
- Made more aware of programmes and events

Among all 50 stakeholders surveyed, 60% (three-fifths) were either very satisfied or satisfied with the interaction they had with Special EU Programmes Body. Levels of satisfaction were higher among those involved with INTERREG 5A compared to those involved with PEACE 4 (69% vs. 53%) (figure 48).

Level of satisfaction with interaction with SEUPB




How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the level of interaction you receive from the SEUPB? [  $Base: Stakeholders \, n=50$  ]

Stakeholders were required to assess the overall level of support and guidance they received about the programmes. Some 64% were satisfied with the support and guidance they had received.

Levels of satisfaction among those involved with INTERREG 5A were higher compared to those involved with PEACE 4 (69% vs. 59%) (figure 49).

Assessment of support and guidance received




In your opinion, how satisfied or dissatisfied are you with overall level of support and guidance you receive about the programmes? [Base: Stakeholders n=50]

#### 12. PROGRAMME INFORMATION - STAKEHOLDERS

Of the stakeholders involved with the PEACE 4 programme, 53% (over half) agreed or strongly agreed they were kept well informed about the progress of the programme (figure 50).

Extent of agreement – "I am kept well informed about the progress of the PEACE 4 Programme"




To what extent do you agree or disagree with the statement, "I am kept well informed about the progress of the PEACE 4 Programme" [Base: Stakeholders n=50]

Extent of agreement – "I am kept well informed about the progress of the INTERREG 5A Programme"




To what extent do you agree or disagree with the statement? – I am kept well informed about the progress of the INTERREG 5A Programme

Preferred methods of receiving information




What are your preferred methods of receiving information about the programme? [ Base: Stakeholders n=50 ]


#### 12. AWARENESS OF STRUCTURAL FUNDS - STAKEHOLDERS

Around 1 in 3 (32%) stakeholders regarded the PEACE 4 programme as falling under the European Regional Development Fund. This figure was greater among those involved with the actual programme (44%). Fifteen percent of those involved with PEACE 4 believed the programme fell under the ESF, another 18% believed the programme fell under the Cohesion Fund (figure 53).

Structural fund PEACE 4 falls under






Can you name the structural fund that PEACE 4 falls under? [ Base: Stakeholders n=50 ]

Approaching half (46%) of stakeholders regarded the INTERREG 5A programme as falling under the European Regional Development Fund. Again, this figure was greater among those involved with the actual programme (78%). None of those involved with the programme believed the fund fell either under the ESF or under the Cohesion Fund (figure 54).


Structural fund INTERREG 5A falls under

#### 13. IMPACT OF PROGRAMMES - STAKEHOLDERS

Stakeholders were asked separately for each programme if the programmes were having a positive impact, or making no difference. Seventy four percent of those involved in PEACE 4 perceived the programme to be having a positive impact. More positive trends were found for INTERREG 5A, of those involved 96% perceiving the programme to be having a positive impact (figure 55).




In your opinion, is the PEACE 4/ INTERREG 5A programme having a positive impact or is it making no difference? [ Base: Stakeholders n=50 ]

#### 14. THE APPLICATION PROCESS - STAKEHOLDERS

Stakeholders were further asked to comment on how long they 'think' it takes to process a funding application, then how long they think it 'should' take to process a funding application. Two-fifths (40%) perceived a funding application to be processed between 3-6 months. Just over a tenth (12%) suggested 6-12 months. Perceptions suggested that funding applications in relation to INTERREG 5A were taking slightly longer to process, as more stakeholders involved with this programme stated longer timeframes than those involved with PEACE 4. Notably, no one who was either involved with PEACE 4 or INTERREG 5A thought it took under 3 months to process a funding application (figure 56).


Length of time think it takes to process funding application

How long do you think it should take the SEUPB to process a funding application? [ Base: Stakeholders n=50 ]


#### 15. FINANCIAL CONTROLS - STAKEHOLDERS

The participating stakeholders were asked to describe the financial controls used within PEACE 4 and INTERREG 5A. Three in ten (30%) described these controls as 'adequate' whilst 48% found the controls too rigorous and inflexible. Those involved in INTERREG 5A, were more likely to find the controls too rigorous and inflexible (52%) compared to those involved in PEACE 4 (44%).

None of the stakeholders described the financial controls as being 'too lax'. (figure 58).

How would you describe the financial controls used within the PEACE 4 and INTERREG 5A programme? [Base: Stakeholders n=50]



#### 17. ADEQUATE GUIDANCE SUPPORT FROM THE SEUPB

Figure 62 shows almost 9 in 10 (86%) stakeholders believed that projects in receipt of financial assistance under the PEACE 4 or INTERREG 5A programme received adequate guidance support from the SEUPB. Opinions did not vary greatly between those involved in PEACE 4 and those involved in INTERREG 5A.

#### 18. SUMMARY

- Awareness of the Special EU Programmes Body was highest in Northern Ireland compared to the other areas sampled
  - o 14% awareness in Northern Ireland
  - 16% awareness in border counties
  - 4% awareness in western Scotland
- Awareness of PEACE 4 was higher in the border counties
  - 45% awareness in border counties
  - o 39% awareness in Northern Ireland
- More border county than Northern Ireland respondents aware of the PEACE 4 programme believed it was having a positive impact
  - 87% of those from border counties
  - o 74% of Northern Ireland respondents
- Awareness of INTERREG 5A was also higher in the border counties
  - o 21% awareness in border counties
  - o 12% awareness in Northern Ireland
  - o 3% awareness in western Scotland
- More border county respondents aware of the INTERREG 5A programme believed it was having a positive impact
  - 85% of border county respondents
  - 62% of those from Northern Ireland
- Border county and Northern Ireland residents were equally aware of the areas receiving funding to help promote cross border working and co-operation, and to encourage peace and reconciliation
  - o 65% awareness in border counties
  - o 66% awareness in Northern Ireland
  - o 14% awareness in western Scotland
- Among those aware of the programmes, 87% of border county respondents agreed 'EU funding is making a positive difference to communities'; while 75% of Northern Ireland respondents agreed
- Among those aware of the programmes, 79% of border county respondents agreed 'EU funding is investing in your future'; while 68% of Northern Ireland respondents agreed
- Among stakeholders involved in PEACE 4, 50% agreed with the statement 'I think PEACE 4 is achieving its objectives'; while 78% involved in INTERREG 5A agreed with the statement 'I think INTERREG 5A is achieving its objectives'

- 60% of stakeholders were satisfied with the level of information they received from the Special EU Programmes Body
- > 64% of stakeholders assessed the support and guidance received as very or fairly good
- Among stakeholders involved in PEACE 4, 53% agreed with the statement 'I am kept well informed about the progress of the PEACE 4 programme'; while 70% involved in INTERREG 5A agreed with the statement 'I am kept well informed about the progress of the INTERREG 5A programme'
- Preferred method of communication by the vast majority was via email from SEUPB
- 32% of all stakeholders stated the PEACE 4 programme fell under the European Regional Development Fund; with 46% claiming the INTERREG 5A programme fell under the ERDF.
