# REPORT ON THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD FOR THE TWO YEARS ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

### Constitution

1. The Agricultural Wages Board for Northern Ireland (the Board) is constituted under the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 1977. The Board's functions are to fix the minimum rates of wages and certain other related matters, such as holiday remuneration for agricultural workers in Northern Ireland.

# **Agricultural Workforce**

2. The total number of persons working both full and part-time in Northern Ireland farms at 1 June 2015 was 48,100, an increase of 0.4% on the 2014 total of 47,900. An increase was recorded in the category of Total Farmers, while there was a decrease in the Spouses and Other Workers categories. Further details of employment are set out in the appendix.

#### **Activities of the Board**

- 3. The Board held three meetings in 2014 and three meetings in 2015. It made two Orders during this period. Order No. 94 in 2014 increased the minimum rate of wages for agricultural workers by 1.8% across all grades from 6 April 2014. Order No. 95 in 2015 increased the minimum rate of wages for agricultural workers by 2.4% across all grades from 6 April 2015.

# **Appointments**

5. Three appointments were made under Article 3 and Schedule 1 of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 1977. Mr Rodger McKnight was appointed Chair and Ms Eileen Mullan was appointed Independent Member. The appointments are for a 3 year period, expiring 31 May 2017. Ms Patricia O'Callaghan was appointed Independent Member and the appointment is also for a 3 year period, expiring 31 March 2018.

# **Holiday Entitlement**

7. The minimum holiday entitlement for an agricultural worker is 5.6 weeks or 28 days (proportionally). An agricultural worker in continuous employment with the same employer for more than one year is entitled to a maximum of 29 days, made up of 28 days leave plus one additional day from a list of 14 public holidays.

### **Enforcement of Minimum Rates**

8. The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development is responsible for ensuring compliance with the provisions of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order 1977 and Orders made by the Agricultural Wages Board. Department Inspectors investigate complaints by workers about any matters within remit of the Board's Orders. # **Complaints**

9. One complaint against an employer was received during the period of the report. The issue is currently ongoing.
