

Statutory Consultations Quarterly Report Q2 2024/25

Introduction

This quarterly report highlights the performance of statutory consultees in the planning process. It provides details of the volume of statutory consultation that has taken place during the first six months of 2024/25 with comparative data from previous years.

The figures contained in this report are extracted from the Planning Portals, are management information, and should not be treated as official statistics.

Statutory consultations

During the first six months of 2024/25 (1 April to 30 September 2024) there were 18,411 consultations/advice queries raised with 73% (13,478) of these consultations sent to key statutory consultees¹. Of the 13,478 consultations/advice queries raised with statutory consultees, 77% (10,437) were deemed to be statutory consultations², with the remainder largely made up of consultations on full applications (992), discharge of conditions (555), pre application discussions (513), listed building consents (301), advertising (264) and outline applications (189).

The number of statutory consultations raised by planning application type is reported in Table 1. The series is available from 2019/20.

In 2019/20 there was typically over six thousand statutory consultations raised each quarter. The consultation level fell in Q4 2019/20 (January to March 2020), compared with earlier guarters in that year and a further decrease was reported for Q1 2020/21 (April to June 2020). It is likely that these decreases were a consequence of the coronavirus (COVID-19). See Table 1.

Statutory consultation returned to expected levels in Q2 2020/21 (July to September 2020) and remained stable to the end of 2020/21. Consultation then increased peaking in the first quarter of 2021/22 (April to June 2021) with 7,440 statutory consultations. From October 2021 up to September 2022 quarterly consultation levels were reasonably steady.

In Q3 2022/23 (October – December 2022) there was a notable decline in consultation levels which is likely to be related to the introduction of the Planning Portal in early December 2022. Prior to the go live of the new planning system the existing system was unavailable for a period which will have contributed to lower levels of consultation. In Q2 and Q3 of 2023/24 consultation declined to some of the lowest levels reported across the series. Levels increased in the last quarter of 2023/24 but have retracted in the first two quarter of 2024/25. See Table 1.



As in previous quarters, statutory consultations on local planning applications accounted for most of the consultations raised during the second quarter of 2024/25 (94%). See Chart 1.

Planning Applications Received

With exception of a period impacted by the coronavirus pandemic, the number of planning applications received remained relatively stable from 2017/18 to 2020/21; with 99% of all planning applications received being local.

During Q1 2020/21, the first full quarter impacted by the restrictions put in place due to the coronavirus pandemic, the number of applications received was 2,309. This was the lowest number received in any quarter since the series began in April 2002. The following four quarters recorded consecutive increases, peaking in Q1 2021/22. In total there was 13,600 applications received in 2020/21, the highest annual number since 2011/12.

In contrast, there was 10,025 planning applications received during 2023/24, the lowest number of applications received in any year since records began in on 2002/03. The 10,025 received in 2023/24 represented a decrease of 11% from the previous year (11,217).

In the first two quarters of 2024/25 there were 2,535 and 2,371 planning applications received respectively. While the level of planning applications received has been stable over the last five quarters there has been a gradual decline in the number of planning applications received over time.

The ratio of all planning applications received against all statutory consultations issued was 1 to 2. For major and regionally significant, the ratio is 1 to 10^3 . See Table 3 below for more detail.

Statutory consultations response times

During 2019/20 the proportion of statutory consultations responded to on time⁵ was 69%, this rate increased to 76% in 2020/21, returning to 69% the following year and 72% in 2022/23. It is noteworthy that a much higher level of statutory consultation was carried out in 2021/22 (27,191) when compared to other years in the series. The response rate for 2023/24 was 74%.

The response rate for the first six months of 2024/25 was 79%. Eighty percent of responses were on time during the first quarter of the year, the highest quarterly response rate recorded. In the second quarter of 2024/25 77% of responses were recorded on-time.

Table 4 provides a breakdown of responses to statutory consultations raised each quarter since reporting began in in 2019/20.

Chart 2 illustrates the number of responses to statutory consultations quarterly by response status from 2022/23. As with previous reports, the number of outstanding statutory consultations is highest in the most recent quarter, primarily a result of lifting the information at a point in time. Quarter four in each year has a higher proportion of outstanding than any other quarter within that year due to the annual position becoming fixed shortly after the year end, with no further revisions being made. Chart 3 provides a proportionate breakdown of these responses.





Chart 2: Number of responses to statutory consultations received by response status

The response rate for statutory consultations responded to on time⁶ varies from quarter to quarter and year to year. In broad terms the quarterly response rate on-time over the last five years has ranged between 64-80% for all statutory consultations. For consultations related to local planning applications the response rate on-time has ranged between 68-81%, and for consultations related to major planning applications ranging between 43-66%.

In the first six months of 2024/25 79% of responses to statutory consultations were on time. Response to statutory consultations on locals is reported at 80%, majors at 61% and regionally

Chart 4a: <u>Responses to statutory consultations received for **local** planning applications by response status (proportions)</u>





Chart 4b: <u>Responses to statutory consultations received for **major** planning applications by response status (proportions)</u>






Chart 4c: <u>Responses to statutory consultations received for **regionally significant** planning applications by response status (proportions)</u>


Of the 10,437 statutory consultations received in the first six months of 2024/25, DfI Roads received 43%, DAERA EMF NIEA 20%, NI Water 15%, DfI Rivers 11% and DfC / HED 10%. Together these five consultees accounted for 98% of the statutory consultations raised during the first six months of 2024/25 (Chart 5).⁸ This is like the position recorded in previous quarters.

During the first six months of the year across all statutory consultees the proportion of responses received on time 9 ranged from 51% - 100%. In all, 79% of statutory consultations were responded on time during the first six months of 2024/25. Table 6 provides response information for each statutory consultee for April to September 2024.

User guidance

Data source

An extract of all consultations/advice queries raised from 1 April 2024 to 30 September 2024 were transferred on in November 2024 from the Planning Portals. The data were then validated. The relevant data is lifted at least one month after the end of the reference period to allow for the 21-day target response date, which applies to most statutory consultations, to have elapsed.

Reporting

The Planning Portals were introduced in June (Mid Ulster) and December 2022 (all other planning authorities) and will have had some impact on the quality of the data for level of consultation and the management of consultation responses. This impact, whilst considered to be minimal, may cause some changes at lower levels of data disaggregation. For this reason, caution should be taken when using data from 2022/23.

The figures contained in this report are extracted from the Planning Portals, are management information, and should not be treated as official statistics.
