








## Week beginning 26th May 2025

Grass Growth – AFBI Hillsborough and CAFRE Greenmount Plots




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## **MANAGEMENT NOTES:**

- Walk the farm at least weekly to enable early identification of a deficit or surplus
  in the grass wedge. If as forecast, growth is below demand, increase
  supplementation or introduce silage aftermath into the grazing platform to
  decrease stocking rate and maintain rotation length. Try to keep a 21-day rotation
  and not let Average Farm Cover (AFC) drop below 2,100kgDM/ha.
- The previously high growth rates followed by the dry spell has resulted in a lot of paddocks going stemmy, even at low covers. This mature grass should be premoved or, if practical, removed by baling to improve grass quality for subsequent rotations. An application of chemical N will also help to maintain regrowth quality.
- With rain having arrived forecasting models are predicting a gradual recovery to growth rates, in line with the long term average, during the next two weeks.
